TAKE CHARGE OF YOUR LIFE

Perhaps you're currently working but not entirely fulfilled. Maybe you want to upgrade your skills for advancement or you want a career change. We can provide you with the schedule and flexibility you need. Online programming or part-time in-class options let you meet your other obligations while learning for your future.

Here are a few things for you to consider:

- International credentials may be used for admission to our programs. Prospective students must get their international credentials assessed through the International Credential Assessment Service of Canada or World Education Services.
- You can get credit for life experiences through Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition (PLAR). Students enrolled in a program course can apply for PLAR.
- Students may be exempt from compulsory courses completed at another college or university within the past five years. If it has been longer, you may be exempt from general elective courses.
- Anyone 19 years of age or older can apply to some programs without a high school diploma, as long as they meet program eligibility (some testing may be required).
- Advisors in our Academic Access Centre are available to discuss your academic goals and identify the necessary steps to reach them.
