ABOUT NYA

Northern Youth Abroad (NYA) provides opportunities for youth living in Nunavut and the Northwest Territories to gain career skills and training, hands on work experience, leadership development, and high school credits through a crosscultural learning and work experience in southern Canada and abroad. As a participant, each youth completes a series of assignments in their home community, attends a program orientation and de-briefing, and completes a summer placement.

For the Canadian Program, Participants live in a southern host community. While in the south they live with a host family and volunteer at a work placement for 35 hours a week.

For the NYA Next Program, Participants live at Algonquin College in a college residence with a group of other participants and complete a construction trades course and learn about their own career and education next steps.

NYA offers youth an opportunity for personal growth. We are particularly committed to supporting youth who have had limited opportunities to travel outside their home communities or participate in this type of programming before.

PARTICIPANT REFERRAL FORM

Each NYA applicant is required to submit two 'Participant Referral Forms' in support of their application — one from their mentor, and one from another adult who is not an immediate family member. The referral helps determine if NYA is a good fit for the applicant while allowing us to get to know them a little bit better.

<u>All information is treated confidentially</u> and can be submitted to us online, or via fax, e-mail, or letter mail. If you run out of space, please feel free to provide additional information about the applicant on extra pages.

Please be frank and honest in your comments so that we can develop a clear understanding of the young person being referred. Being candid about a youth's circumstances and/or history will not disqualify someone from being chosen. It will help us ensure that we have the needed supports in place to promote each participant's success, while protecting the well-being and safety of all involved.
